

ROMANIZATION SYSTEM FOR MACEDONIAN CYRILLIC

BGN/PCGN 1981 Agreement

Macedonian was officially established as a literary language in Yugoslavia during World War II and is now the official language of Macedonia. Its alphabet is identical to Serbian Cyrillic, except that the characters ђ and љ are replaced by ř and ř, respectively, and the character s and the apostrophe are added.

NOTES

1. The character ř should be romanized **g (G)** when it occurs before e and и. In all other instances, it should be romanized **đ (Đ)**.
2. The character ќ should be romanized **k** when it occurs before e and и. In all other instances, it should be romanized **ć**.

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
